

THE MESSAGE OF 1 PETER

WHY WE SHOULD LIVE A HOLY LIFE:

 We should be holy in our lifestyle because of the nature of God (1:15-16) "Be Holy for I am Holy"

- We should be holy in our lifestyle because of our calling from God (1:17) We are "temporary residents"
- We should be holy in our lifestyle because of cost of salvation (1:18-21) "Precious blood of Christ"



Verses 17–21 form one long sentence in the original language, which further explains the call to a new life of holiness in light of who God is.

1 Peter 1:17, NIV:

"Since you call on a Father who judges each person's work impartially, live out your time as foreigners here in reverent fear."



From the Bible we can surmise that God will ask us two crucial questions:

First,

"What did you do with my Son, Jesus Christ?"



BELIEVE & RECEIVE

"Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God"

John 1:12



Second Question,

"What did you do with what I gave you?"

What did you do with your life—all the gifts, talents, opportunities, energy, relationships, and resources God gave you? Did you spend them on yourself, or did you use them for the purposes God made you for?
