EMPOWERING Leadership

There will always be leadership in a group in any setting – but what TYPE of leadership, is it **EMPOWERING Leadership?**



We see this principle worked out in the Bible repeatedly.

- Jethro & Moses Exodus 18 (v21-22)
- Jesus Mark 3:13-14, Matthew 10:1-5
 (12 sent out), Luke 10:1 (72 send out)
- Early Church Acts 6:1-4 appointed "deacons" = servants
- Paul Eph 4:-11-12 "Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do his work"

1 Cor 3:1-9 Pauls says an immature, sinful approach from individuals or churches is to be focused on jealousy, rivalry or comparison:

ONLY SERVANTS WHO HAVE BEEN GIVEN A TASK AND WHO ARE EXPECTED TO BE FAITHFUL

Building A Healthy Church Community involves **GIFT-FOCUSED** Ministry



This is the responsibility of those who lead:

GIFT FOCUSED Ministry is critical to a health
church community because

- The role of Christian leadership is to help its members identify their gifts and integrate them into appropriate ministries.
- When Christians function in their area of giftedness, they generally function less in their own strength and more in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- People are less likely to get burned out using their gifts (and not trying to be someone else).



1 Cor 12, Romans 12:1-8, Ephesians 4:11-16, 1 Peter 4:7, 9-11

ALL KEY TEXTS TO HELP US SEE THAT:

- Everyone has been given a gift by God so that everyone can serve,
- Everyone is important, that we need one another in the family of God.
- Some of you need my gifts & I need yours.
- That's where INTERDEPENDENT not to operate independently.
