

UNDERSTANDING THE PSALMS

The Book of Psalms is divided into five sections:

- Book 1 (Psalms 1–41)
- Book 2 (Psalms 42–72)
- Book 3 (Psalms 73–89)
- Book 4 (Psalms 90–106)
- Book 5 (Psalms 107–150)



- Some of these have individual titles, while others do not.
- Some include musical direction or refer to the "leader" or "choir master."
- Sometimes there are references to the type of music that should be played along with the song. For example, "with stringed instruments."
- In the Psalms, readers will find references to specific names as well. For example, the sons of Korah (mentioned eleven times) and Asaph (mentioned twelve times).



THE TYPES OF PSALMS

- Psalms of Thanksgiving: Praise to God for His gracious acts. Psalm 34, 92, 95, 100, 111
- Psalms for Royalty: The king was often the patron of the temple, and this was the case in Jerusalem. These psalms are historical windows of Israel before their exile when there was still a king on the throne. Psalms 20, 21, 45, 72, 89, 110, 132.



THE TYPES OF PSALMS

- Psalms of Wisdom: Teach us to cultivate our hearts to focus on what truly matters like our eternity and relationship with God rather than living for short-term gain. Psalms 1,14,73,112, 119.
- **Psalms of Lament:** These psalms are just that, poems and songs that express human struggles of anguish, depression, heartbrokenness, and sadness, injustice, or complaints against God's enemies. Psalms 6,12, 13, 38, 86, 130.

- Psalms of Praise: The Psalm of Praise is a poetic expression of praise and exaltation towards God from its authors. Psalm 8, 42, 43, 103, 145, 150.



THE BENEFITS OF THE PSALMS

- Lament is the largest group of the Psalms more than 60 for individuals and larger groups of people.
- Individual Laments 3, 22, 31
- Group Laments 12, 44, 80
