God doesn't just want you to know and love Him, He also wants you to know and love His **family**.

"That family is the church of the living God (1 Tim 3:15b NCV)

"(God's) unchanging plan has always been to adopt us into His own **family** by bringing us to himself through Jesus Christ" ($Eph.\ 1:5$ NLT)

"Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become **children of God**

(John 1:12 NASB)

What comes to mind when you hear the word "church"?

Definition - The Greek word used in the New Testament for church is "EKKLESIA"

This word is made up from 2 Greek words

- "EK" meaning "out" - "KALEO" meaning "to call" So "ekklesia" literally means "that which is called out". The church is made up of all those called out of darkness into light (*Colossians 1:13*).

A redeemed community.

Born and Adopted (*Romans 8:15,23*)



THE CHURCH - UNIVERSAL & LOCAL

The word "church" is used in two senses in the Bible.

- UNIVERSAL CHURCH All believers when they become Christians belong to the church universal, (world-wide throughout ages) (e.g. *Ephesians 1:22, 5:23*)
 Jesus only used the word "church" twice, in Matthew's gospel.
 The first time it was the "universal" church.
 Matthew 16:18 "I will build My Church..."
- 2. THE LOCAL CHURCH The second time Jesus used the word "church" was in *Matthew* 18:15-17

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Two Illustrations to help us

1. THE CHURCH as a SPIRITUAL BUILDING


Ephesians 2: 19-22 1 Peter 2:4-10

2. THE CHURCH as a BODY

Jesus intended His ministry on earth to continue after His ascension. This was to be done through His body on earth, the church, of which He is the Head.

Ephesians 1:22-23 4:12 4:15-16

1 Corinthians 12:12-14, 17



"... 3000 were added - They devoted themselves to teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread and to prayer *Acts 2:41-42*

Four Areas of fellowship to consider.

1. Fellowship of Sharing together.

conversation, meals, ideas, interests..experiences (good and bad), support (rejoice and sorrow). Needs Small groups. (*Acts* 2:44-47)

Jesus said "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

John 13:35



2. Fellowship of Belonging Together

Spectator / Participator

Casual attender / member

Outsider / Insider



3. Fellowship of SERVING Together.

The more you serve the more you love.

For you were called to freedom, brethren; only *do* not *turn* your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

(Galatians 5:13 NASB)




4. Fellowship of SUFFERING Together.

Suffering can bring us together or isolate us

"Share each others troubles and problems, and in this way obey the law of Christ." *Galatians 6:2* NLT

"If one member suffers all suffer together"

1 Cor. 12:26a ESV
